A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LOWER PAXTON TOWNSHIP, DAUPHIN COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA CENSURING PAMELA M. THOMPSON FOR UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR

WHEREAS on February 3rd, 2026, at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Thompson made statements in a setting closely connected to her official role as Chair of the board that were unprofessional and a misuse of her position in connection with an implied self-serving fundraising request.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Lower Paxton Township Dauphin County Pennsylvania that Supervisor Thompson is hereby formally censured.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the censure constitutes an official expression of the Board's disapproval and concern regarding conduct that undermines public trust and the ethical standards expected of Township officials.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be entered into the official minutes and permanent records of the Township and made available to the public in accordance with applicable law.

On February 3, 2026, bids were received via PennBid for the above-referenced project. A total of five bids were received. The bids are summarized on the attached Bid Tabulation form.

YSM Landscape Architects (YSM) reviewed the required bid submittal documents for the apparent low bidder and found them to be complete. The apparent low bidder is SLC Excavating, LLC., the contractor currently completing the Centennial Acres Park & Kohl Memorial Park court improvement project for Lower Paxton Township. In addition to the work at Centennial Acres Park & Kohl Memorial Park, YSM has worked with SLC Excavating, LLC on eight park development projects installations over the past four years, and I can attest to the quality of their work and professionalism.

SLC Excavating, LLC is the lowest responsible bidder for Contract No. 1 – Site Improvement Contract with a base bid of \$279,904.00. A deduct alternate was received to eliminate the basketball court color coat (-\$39,200.00).

Based on the information submitted and their past performance on site construction projects, YSM recommends that Lower Paxton Township award Koons Memorial Park, Contract No. 1 to SLC Excavating, LLC for a contract price of \$279,904.00. YSM recommends that the Township Solicitor review the original bids for authenticity, completeness, and accuracy.

Please let me know when the Township officially awards the contract. Following award, I will provide the Contractor with the Notice of Award and, at the same time, request the performance and payment bonds and insurance certificates. Please contact me if you have any questions or require additional information.

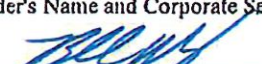

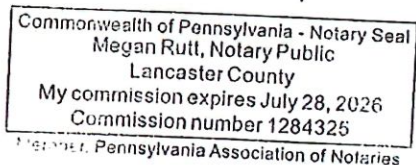

NONDISCRIMINATION/SEXUAL HARASSMENT CLAUSE [Grants]

The Grantee agrees:

1. 3. Neither the Grantee nor any subgrantee nor any contractor nor any subcontractor nor any person on their behalf shall in any manner discriminate by reason of race, gender, creed, color, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or in violation of the PHRA and applicable federal laws, in the provision of services under the grant agreement, subgrant agreement, contract or subcontract.
4. Neither the Grantee nor any subgrantee nor any contractor nor any subcontractor nor any person on their behalf shall in any manner discriminate against employees by reason of participation in or decision to refrain from participating in labor activities protected under the *Public Employee Relations Act*, *Pennsylvania Labor Relations Act* or *National Labor Relations Act*, as applicable and to the extent determined by entities charged with such Acts' enforcement, and shall comply with any provision of law establishing organizations as employees' exclusive representatives.
5. The Grantee, any subgrantee, contractor or any subcontractor shall not discriminate by reason of race, gender, creed, color, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or in violation of the PHRA and applicable federal laws, against any subgrantee, contractor, subcontractor or supplier who is qualified to perform the work to which the grant relates.
7. The Grantee and each subgrantee, contractor and subcontractor represents that it is presently in compliance with and will maintain compliance with all applicable federal,

state, and local laws and regulations relating to nondiscrimination and sexual harassment. The Grantee and each subgrantee, contractor and subcontractor further represents that it has filed a Standard Form 100 Employer Information Report ("EEO-1") with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission ("EEOC") and shall file an annual EEO-1 report with the EEOC as required for employers' subject to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, that have 100 or more employees and employers that have federal government contracts or first-tier subcontracts and have 50 or more employees. The Grantee, any subgrantee, any contractor or any subcontractor shall, upon request and within the time periods requested by the Commonwealth, furnish all necessary employment documents and records, including EEO-1 reports, and permit access to their books, records, and accounts by the granting agency and the Bureau of Diversity, Inclusion and Small Business Opportunities for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the provisions of this Nondiscrimination/Sexual Harassment Clause.

8. The Grantee, any subgrantee, contractor or any subcontractor shall include the provisions of this Nondiscrimination/Sexual Harassment Clause in every subgrant agreement, contract or subcontract so that those provisions applicable to subgrantees, contractors or subcontractors will be binding upon each subgrantee, contractor or subcontractor.
9. ANOTHER BUSINESS STEPS UP FOR NEWSIDE CEMETERY VETERANS

An overgrown stretch of sidewalk adjacent to the graveyard has been a challenge .to volunteers of the Newside Cemetery Restoration Project but a Lower Paxton Township business will dig in to help them overcome the stubborn mess.

For years, water seepage had stimulated grass growth of the sidewalk, the roots accumulating into a near impenetrable carpet that resists manual shoveling.

This Saturday, Nov. 8, the cavalry will arrive on the scene in the form of a skid-loader machine from Hornungs Ace Hardware in Linglestown that should make short work of the mass.

Clearing the sidewalk is important to the overall plans for giving the historic cemetery the recognition it deserved. The Restoration Project is looking to install cement access steps, and the sidewalk needs to be clear so plans can be drawn up.

Among the 48 persons buried at Newside between 1742 and 1854 were 26 early American veterans. They include early Lower Paxton settlers who fought in either the French and Indian War, the Revolution the War of 1812. Documents point to 10 who fought in the Revolution.

Using donated ground penetrating radar services, the Newside Cemetery Restoration Project this past summer discovered that there are no graves in the fenced-in area of tombstones and a memorial placed by the Daughters of the American Revolution in 1924.memorial. The radar discovered that the graves are on the hillside above the small enclosure.

The goal of the Project, part of the Lower Paxton Township Historical Commission, is to place markers on each of the newly discovered graves, enclose the expanded site in fencing and add access steps.

The project is dedicated to accomplishing its goals without expending township tax dollars and will soon launch a fund-raising campaign.

The newly located burials are on land owned by the Four Seasons housing complex, which gave permission for the search and improvement.

The skid loader operation will begin at 11 a.m. Saturday during a work session with volunteers who will clear debris remaining from the removal of several dying trees.

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
