Lower Paxton Township to Implement Mass Notification Tool

Lower Paxton Township has partnered with CivicReady to implement its mass notification solution. Available from

CivicPlus, the integrated technology platform for local governments, the CivicReady solution will allow Lower Paxton Township to issue urgent notifications, emergency instructions, warnings, and even routine communications to subscribed citizens via email, text message, and voicemail, to keep citizens safe and informed. In the event of a local emergency, citizens subscribed to CivicReady will benefit from immediate, actionable information and instructions sent via their

preferred notification channel. CivicReady notifications can be automatically translated into one of 63 languages to maximize the effectiveness of the platform in ensuring mass awareness of potentially impactful situations

The CivicReady tool will become available in September. Township residents will have the opportunity to opt-in or out, and choose the type of communications they would like to receive at no cost. The Township also plans to host information sessions regarding the CivicReady tool

for those that wish to receive more information and training on how to use CivicReady.

K9 Chase Receives Donation of Body Armor

Lower Paxton Township Police Department's K9 Chase has received a bullet and stab protective vest thanks to a charitable donation from the non-profit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. The vest was sponsored by The Peterson and Farling Families and embroidered with the sentiment "Gifted by the Farling Family & the Peterson Family."

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. is a 501c(3) charity located in East Taunton, MA, whose mission is to provide vests and other assistance to law enforcement dogs. The non-profit was established in 2009 to assist law enforcement agencies with this potentially lifesaving body armor for their four-legged K9 officers. Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. has provided over 3,400 protective vests in 50 states, through private and corporate donations, at a value of \$5.7 million dollars.



The program is open to dogs actively employed in the U.S. with law enforcement who are certified and at least 20 months of age. New K9 graduates, as well as K9s with expired vests, are eligible to participate.

The donation to provide one protective vest for a law enforcement K9 is \$950.00. Each vest has a value between \$1,744 – \$2,283, a five-year warranty, and an average weight of 4-5 lbs. There are an estimated 30,000 law enforcement K9s throughout the United States. UPMC Donates Funds to Police Department for AEDs

Members of the Lower Paxton Township Police Department attended UPMC Pinnacle's Medical Staff meeting at the Hilton Harrisburg on June 25, 2019. Medical Staff President, Dr. Ronald Kratz, presented PFC David Shifflett with a \$7,500.00 check for the replacement of aging AEDs. The police department has 3 Physio-Control LIFEPAK 500 units that are between 15-17 years old and are no longer supported by the manufacturer.



heartbeat and allow a normal rhythm to resume following sudden cardiac arrest. Early CPR and access to an AED has been shown to greatly increase the chances of survival.

With the donation, LPPD has placed an order for 4 new Physio-Control LIFEPAK 1000 AED units that will be

placed into service with patrol officers. The new AEDs and fast response from trained patrol officers will strengthen the chance of survival for all residents and visitors of Lower Paxton Township. The Township and the Police Department are grateful to the Medical Staff at UPMC Pinnacle for their generous donation and support.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a lightweight, portable device that delivers an electric shock through the chest to the heart. The shock can potentially stop an irregular

"CODES CORNER"

Lower Paxton Township passed an Ordinance in May restricting the use of fireworks. The full ordinance may be found on the Township’s ECODE360 website.

Here are a few of the highlights from the ordinance:

- ① Consumer fireworks are not permitted on any township property including streets, sidewalks and parks.
- ② No consumer fireworks are permitted on private property without written permission of owner. No consumer fireworks or sparkling devices may be lit

within a vehicle nor thrown from a motor vehicle or building.

- ③ No consumer fireworks are permitted within 150 feet of an occupied structure.
- ④ No consumer fireworks are permitted on a property less than one acre.
- ⑤ No consumer fireworks may be discharged between the hours of 10 pm and 7 am. The cutoff time is extended for New Year’s Eve to 12:30 am. On New Year’s Day and July 4th, the cutoff is extended to 11 pm.
