Two women make history on Lower Paxton Township Board of Supervisors

Lower Paxton Township, PA (January 5, 2024) – Two women have made history on the Lower Paxton Township Board of Supervisors – Robin Lindsey became the Board's first female chairman, and Pamela M. Thompson became its first African American member.

Lindsey and Thompson took their new positions during the reorganization meeting earlier this month.

"I am honored that my fellow board members elected me chairman, and I pledge to continue working for the Township's residents with integrity, transparency, and dedication," said Lindsey, a Board member since 2014. "Together, we will face our challenges and celebrate our successes, always striving for a better, more vibrant community for all."

Pamela M. Thompson is the newest member of the five-person board, securing her seat in the November general election.

"I am humbled and honored to have been elected by the residents of this great Township," Thompson said. "This historic win marks the first African American woman elected in Lower Paxton."

Thompson, a foster mom, teacher, and former Girl Scout leader, said her legal training would help her represent her constituents. She has also worked as a Judge of Elections, a Minority Inspector, and as the Democratic committeewoman in the Township's Second Precinct.

The Lower Paxton Township Board of Supervisors meets at 7 p.m. on the first, second, and third Tuesday of the month. Meetings are open to the public and televised live on
