

Travel Tips

Posted speed limits are enforced.

Park only in designated areas. Parking in day-use areas is not permitted after dusk.

Please remember:

- Stay on the trail
- Wear appropriate shoes
- Don't cut or remove any plants
- Dispose of litter properly in designated bins.

Pets

Township regulations require dogs to be leashed if they are off the owner's property. Dogs must also have a license and a rabies vaccination. Owners must clean up all animal waste. Visit Happy Tails Dog Park located at Kohl Memorial Park. This dog park has a separate small dog area and shade trees. Be sure to bring water for your pet.




Where to Go?

1. Autumn Oaks Trail .36 miles
Starting Point: North on Patton Rd. to Autumn Oaks Dr. on the left.
About: Easy. Paved trail. On-street parking
2. Brightbill Park .80 miles
Starting Point: Rt. 22 to Carolyn Street Park Entrance (on left). Trail starts along parking lot.
About: Easy. Loop trail around park. Gravel/paved path, wooded segment.
3. CD East Middle School Track .25 miles
Starting Point: Rutherford Road to CD East High School Entrance. Travel past HS to CD East Middle School on left. Track is in rear.
About: Easy. Gravel running track. Off-street parking. May not be available during school hours.
4. *Colonial Park Mall (Indoor) .55 miles
Starting Point: Corner of Rt 22 & Colonial Road
About: Easy. Paved, open walking daily 7 am - 9 pm. Off street parking.
5. Darlington Trail at Hocker Park 1.76 miles
Starting Point: Rt. 39 to Blue Mtn Parkway, to Blue Mtn summit. Park is on the left.
About: Moderate. Unimproved pathway along the crest of Blue Mtn. Connects to Boyds Big Tree Preserve.
6. Forest Hills Trail .36 miles
Starting Point: Rt 39 to Forest Hills Dr., right on Continental Dr., entrance on left. Look for trail sign.
About: Difficult. Unimproved pathway; short loop trail. On-street parking.
7. *George Park Nature Trail .47 miles
Starting Point: Rt. 22 to S. Mountain Rd., left on Old Jonestown Rd., then right on Nyes Rd. Entrance on rt.
About: Easy. Paved pathway with educational signage about the wetlands. Off-street parking.
8. Oak Park Trail .40 miles
Starting Point: Driveway to parking area is on the right along Oak Park Road, a quarter mile off Locust Lane
About: Moderate. Unimproved pathway; short loop trail.
9. Linglestown Elementary / Middle School Track .25 miles
Starting Point: N. Mountain Rd. toward Linglestown, school is on left, track in rear.
About: Easy. Quarter-mile gravel running track. Off-street parking. May not be available during school hours.
10. *Linglestown Historical Walking Tour 2 miles
Starting Point: Linglestown Rd & Mountain Rd.
Follow the walking tour guide available at: www.lowerpaxton-pa.gov/historical-committee-O
About: Easy. Walking along sidewalks along Linglestown Road.
11. Mountain View Elementary School Trail .15 miles
Starting Point: Rt. 22 to Lockwillow Ave., left on Freedom St., rt on Gibbel Rd. to school entrance.
About: Easy. Paved loop trail around ball fields. Off-street parking. May not be available during school hours.
12. Oscar Lingle Trail at Kohl & Lingle Parks .92 miles
Starting Point: Union Deposit Rd. to Dowhower Rd. Park entrance on rt. Trail entrance is off parking lot.
About: Moderate difficulty. Unimproved pathway. Trail network with loop. Off street parking at Kohl Park.
13. Rockford Heights Trail .22 miles
Starting Point: Rt. 22, left on N. Mountain Rd., right on Blue Ridge Ave., left onto Rockford Dr., entrance on left
About: Difficult. Unimproved pathway in a ravine with turnaround. On-street parking.
14. Stray Winds Trail .92 miles
About: Easy. Paved trail along McIntosh Rd. off of Colonial Rd. Parking available at Stray Winds Park (4001 McIntosh Road)
15. *Blue Ridge Meadow Farm 1 mile
Starting Point: At the entrance to Blue Meadow Farm off of Blue Mountain Parkway.
About: Easy. Paved loop trail along St. Thomas Blvd.

*ADA Accessible

The numbers on this map show the general location of the various trails and paths described on the inside of the brochure.
