**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF LOWER PAXTON TOWNSHIP,
DAUPHIN COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ADOPTING BUDGETS AND ESTABLISHING RATES OF
TAXATION FOR LOWER PAXTON TOWNSHIP FOR THE 2026 FISCAL YEAR.**

WHEREAS, The Township Manager has prepared and submitted a proposed 2026 budget for each of the Township's funds to the Board of Supervisors, who conducted public budget workshops wherein the proposed 2026 budgets for all funds were reviewed and, if necessary, amended as determined by the Board of Supervisors and as advertised for inspection by the public

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Lower Paxton Township that the approved fiscal year 2026 budgets for operating, and capital funds shall be:

Fire Protection Tax and Equipment Fund operations revenue is \$4,485,480, and expenditures are \$4,439,600. Capital Reserves revenue is \$72,080, and expenditure is \$0.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a tax be and is hereby levied on all real property within Lower Paxton Township at the rate of 1.554 mills for general purposes, 1.240 mills for fire protection, and 0.041 mills for library funding for every \$1000 of assessed valuation of taxable property, totaling 2.835 mills of real estate tax.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 1.240 mills for fire protection is budgeted to provide dedicated real estate tax millage towards purchase/maintenance of fire apparatus, make appropriations to fire companies located inside the Township, maintain fire hydrant water service, and pay current (and accumulate for future) salaries, benefits, or other compensation of fire suppression employees of the Township.
